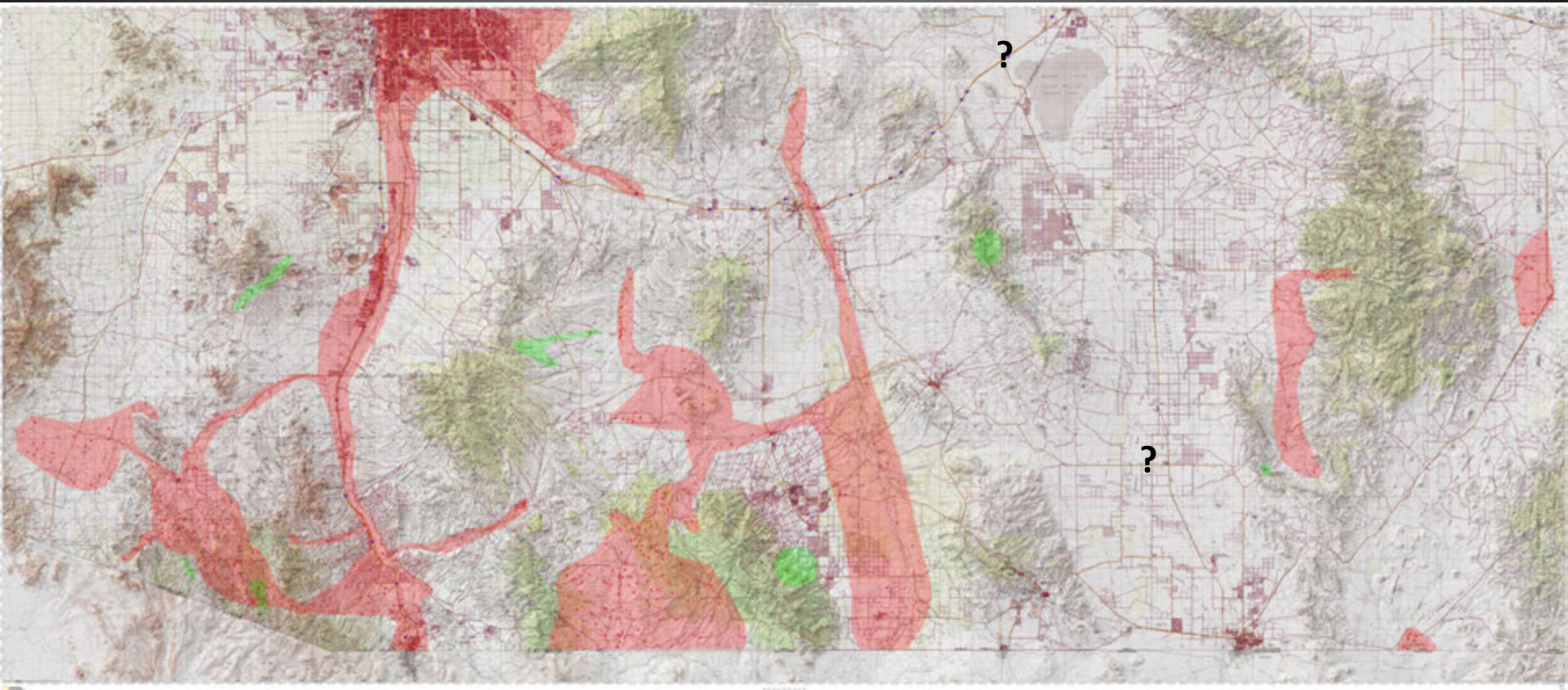

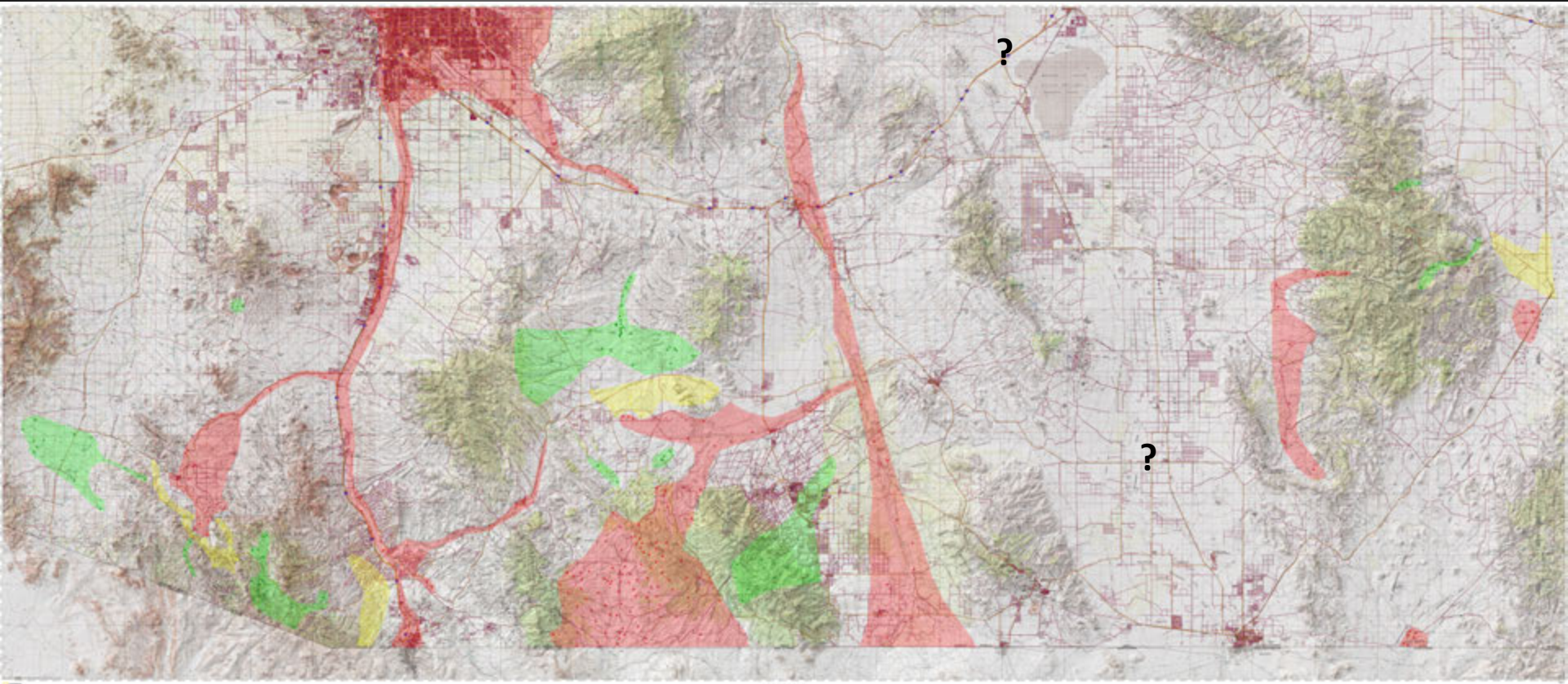
2001 American Bullfrog (red) and Chiricahua Leopard frog (green) distributions in SE Arizona.



Width = 66 miles, length = 155 miles



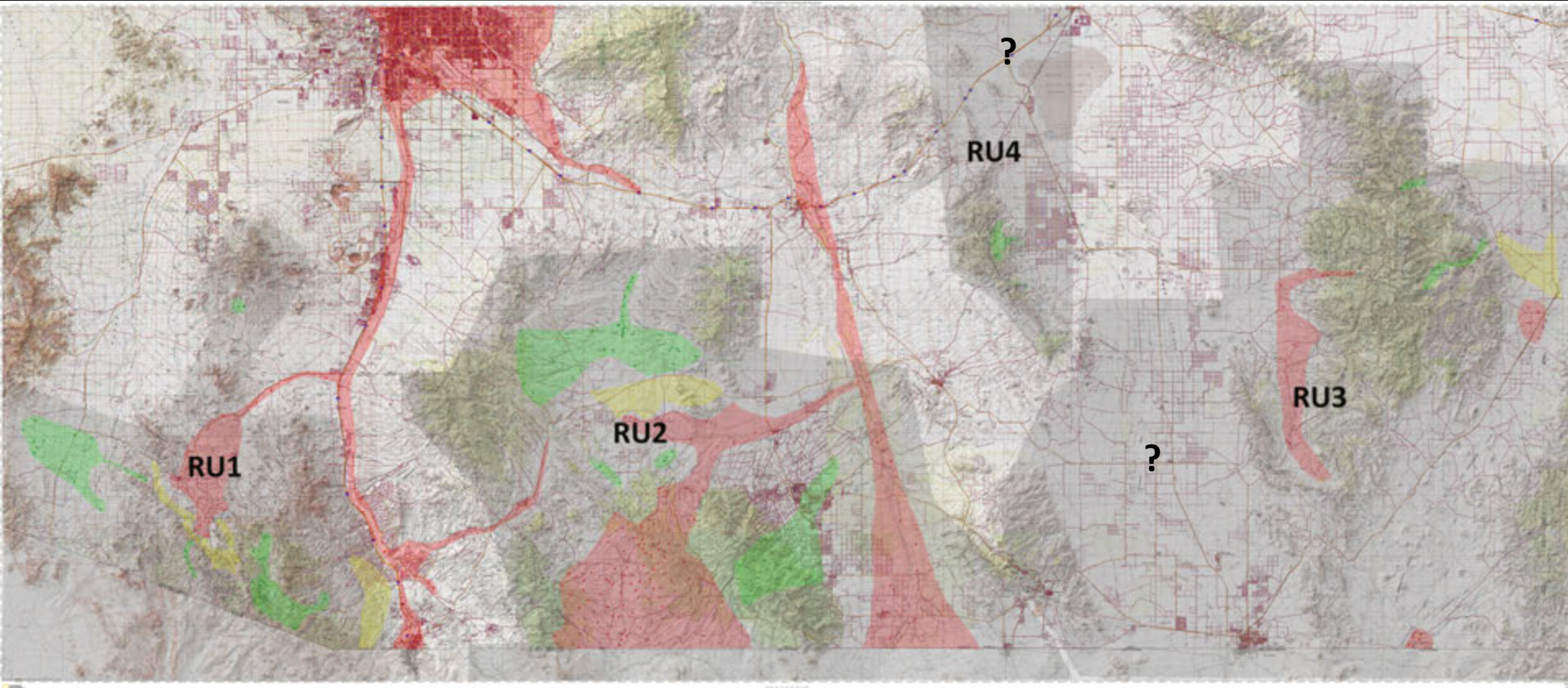
2019 American Bullfrog (red) and Chiricahua Leopard frog (green) distributions in SE Arizona along with buffer zones (yellow).



Width = 66 miles, length = 155 miles



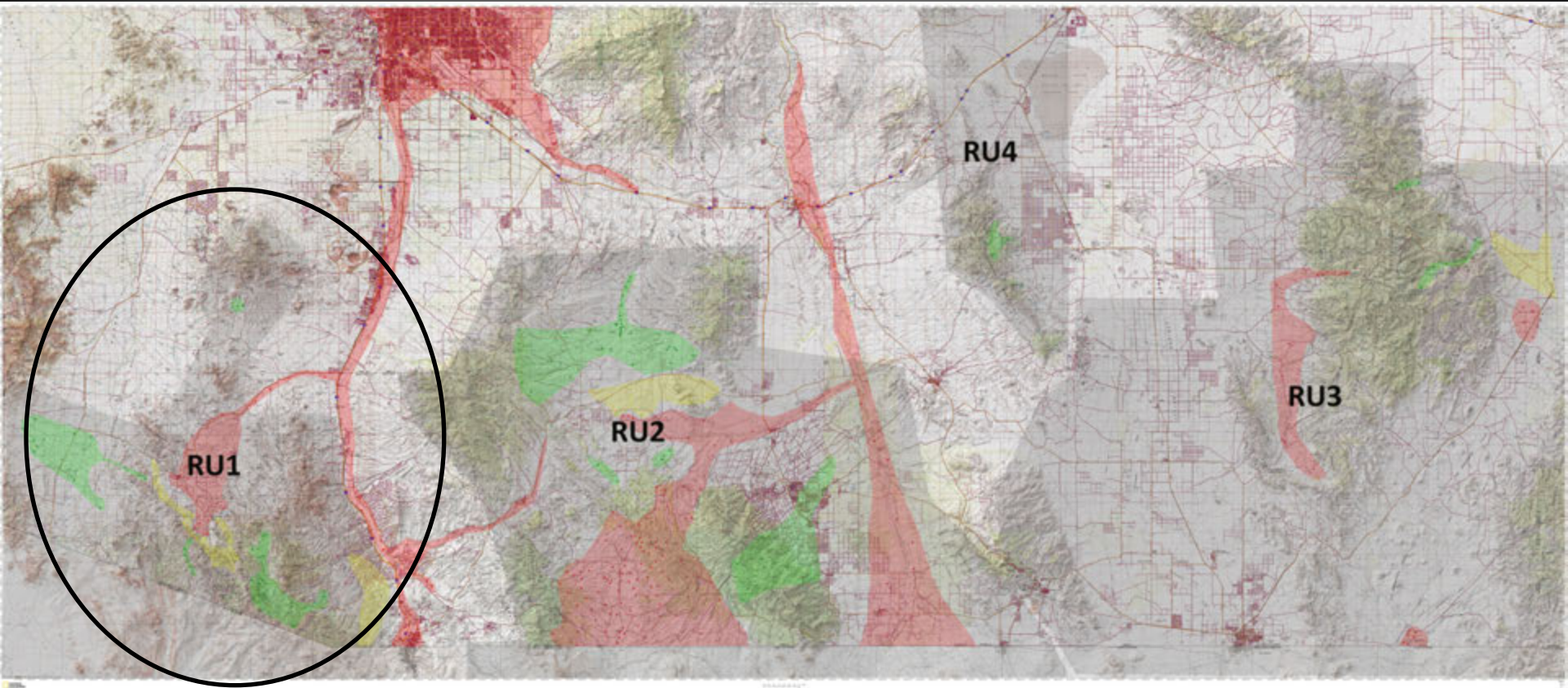

Width = 66 miles, length = 155 miles

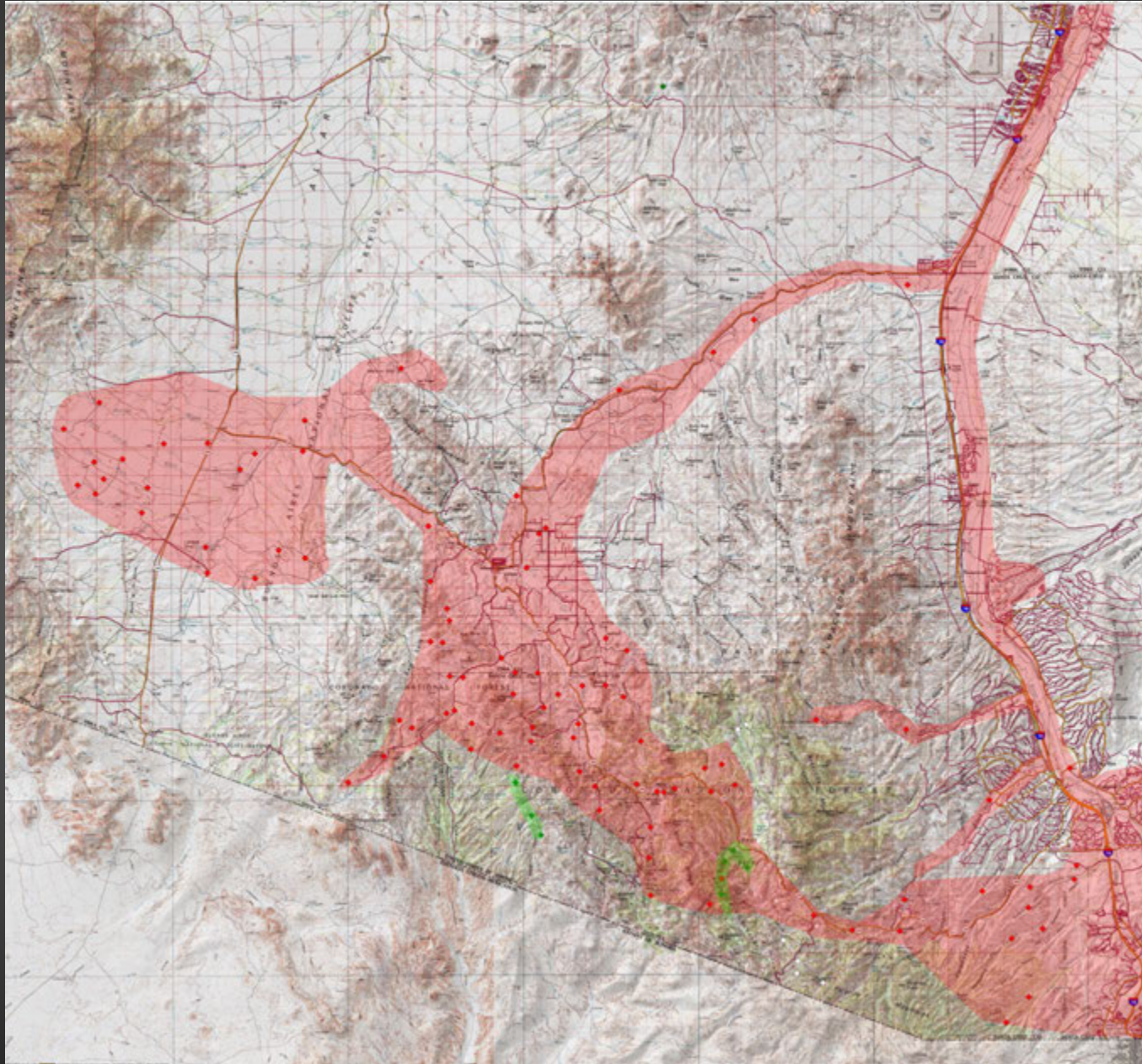


How did RU1 get to where it is today?



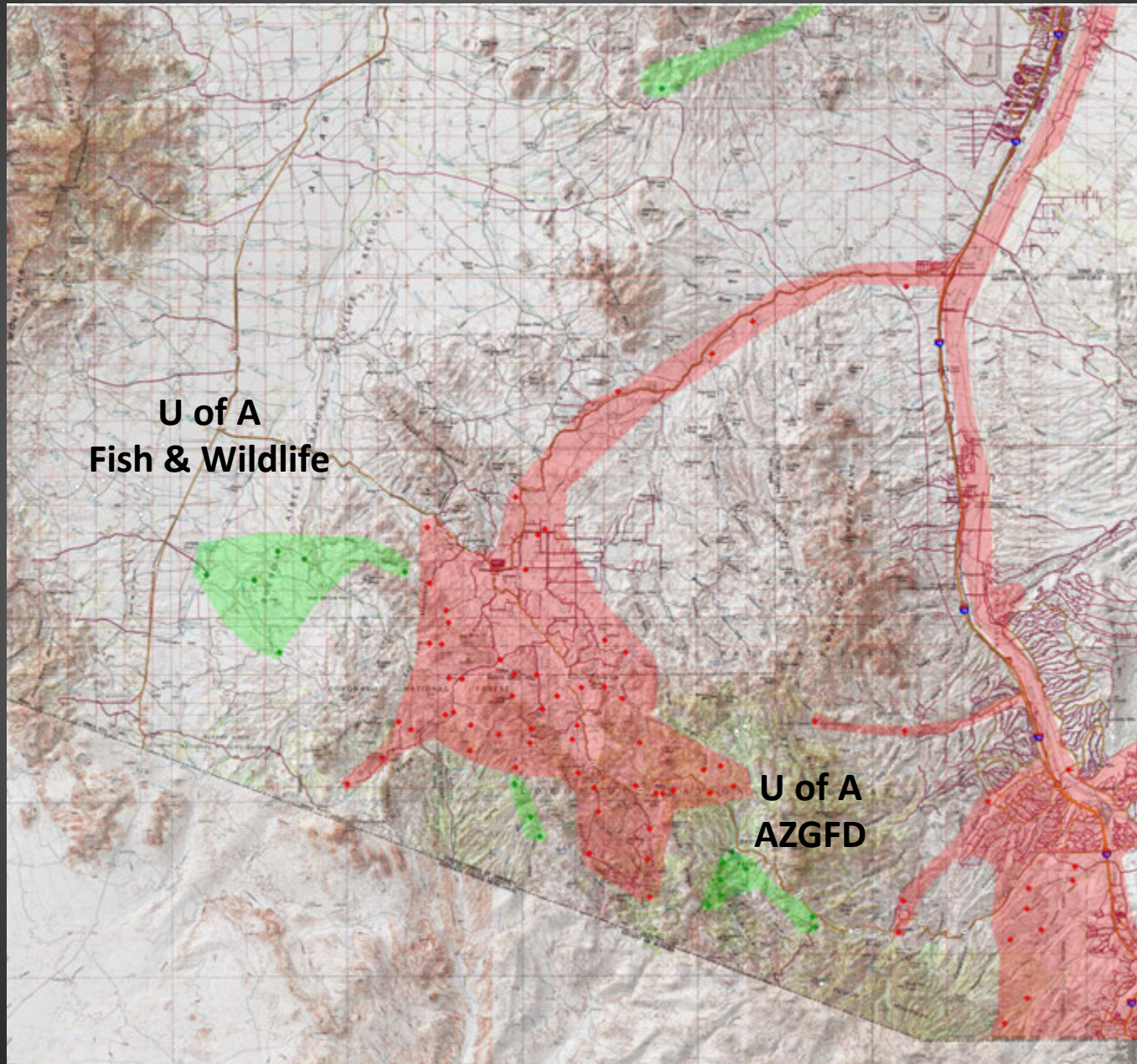

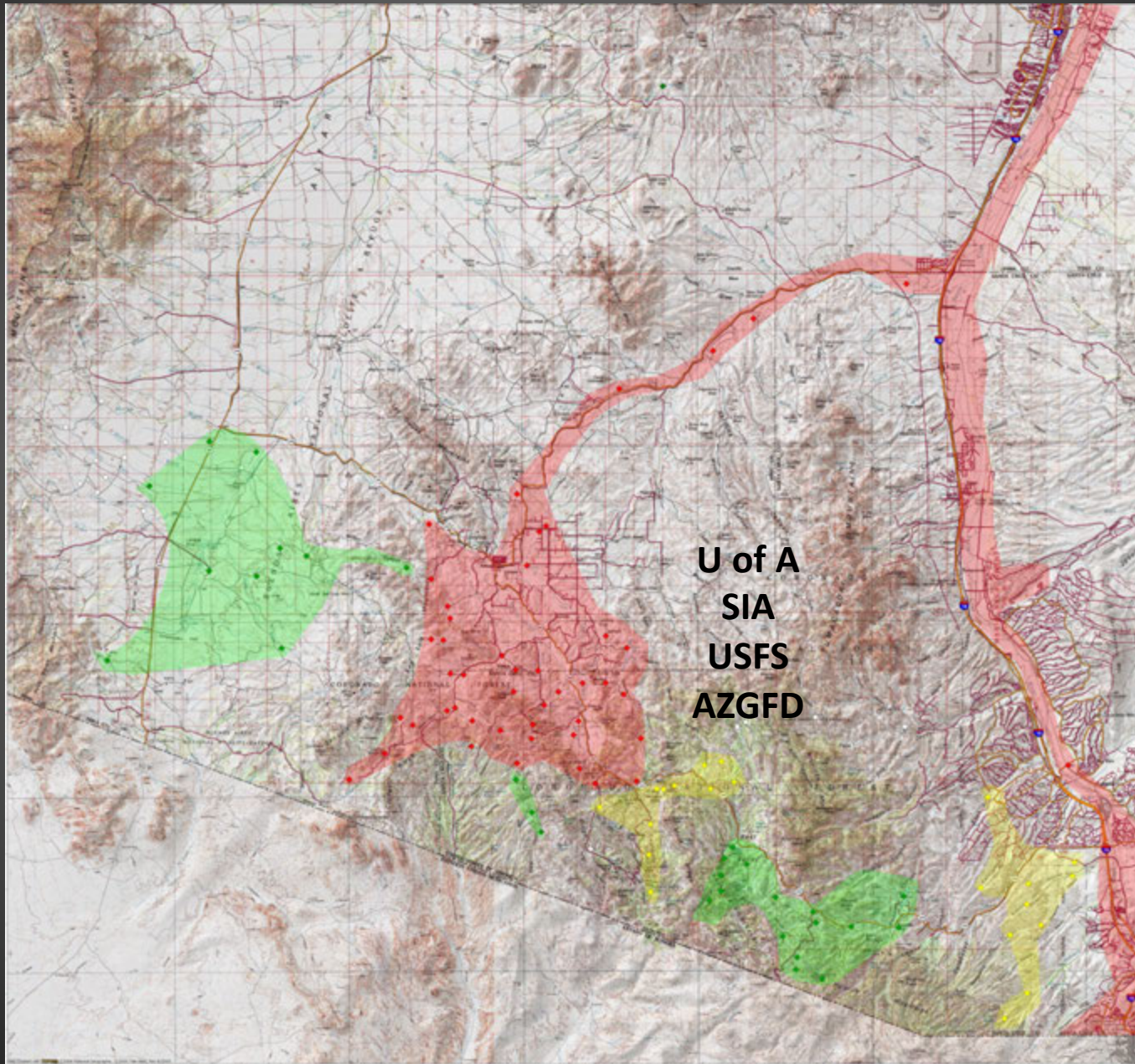

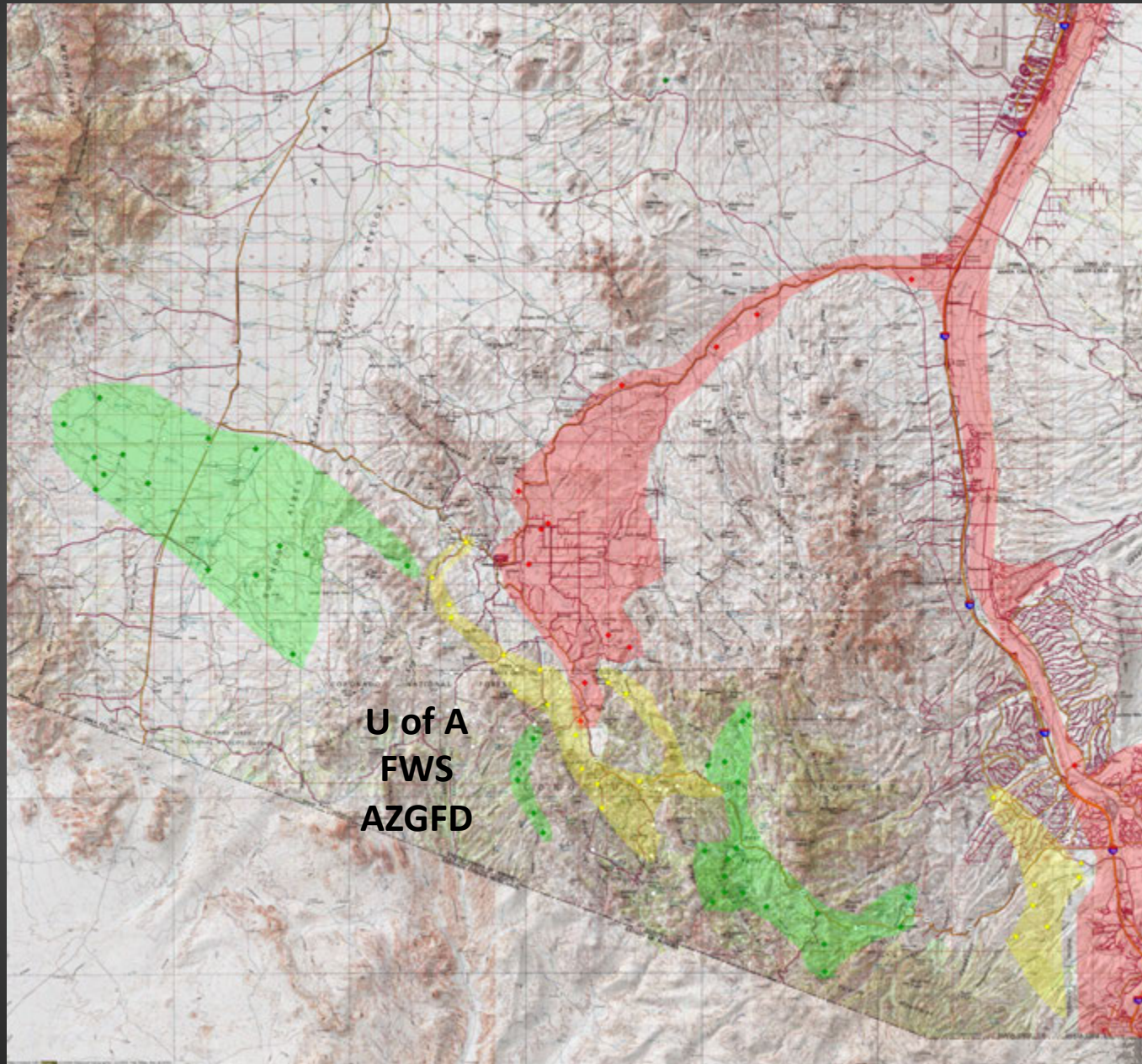

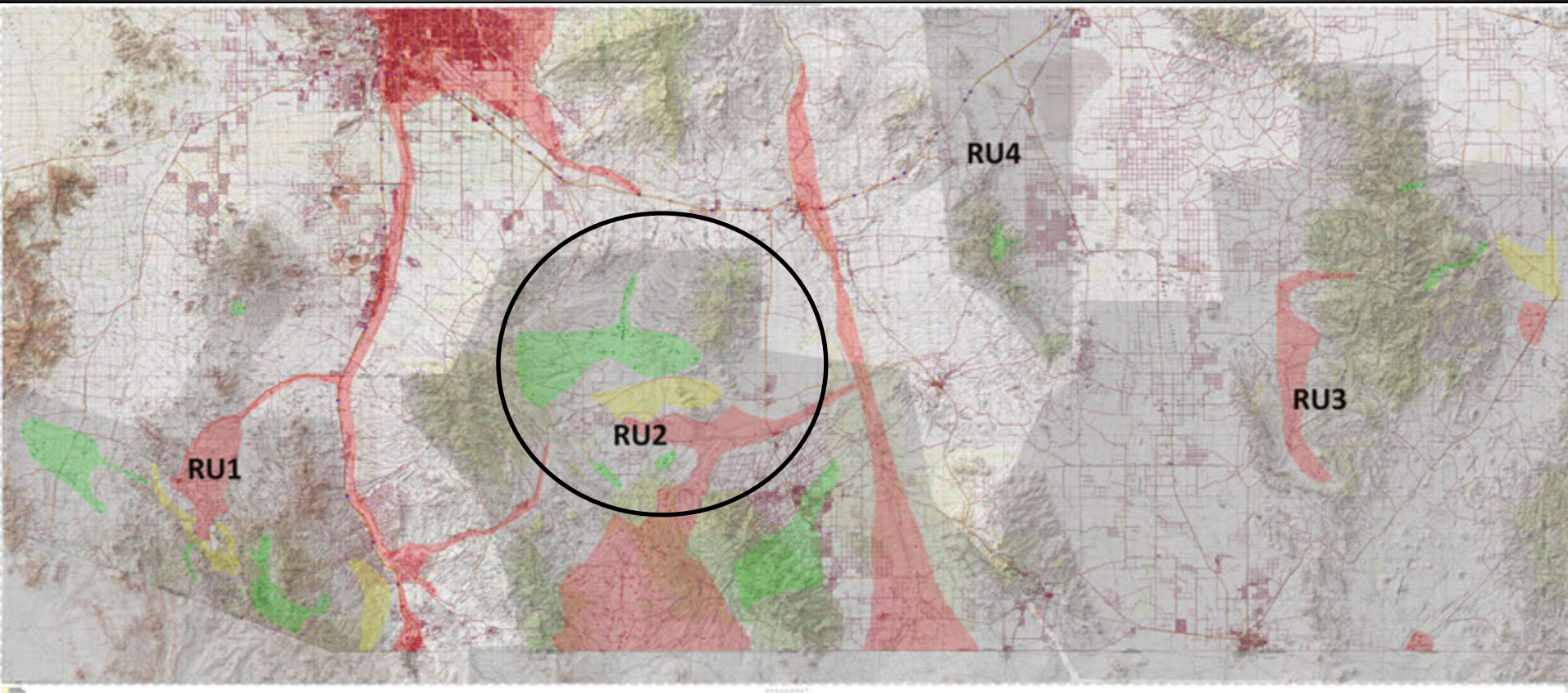

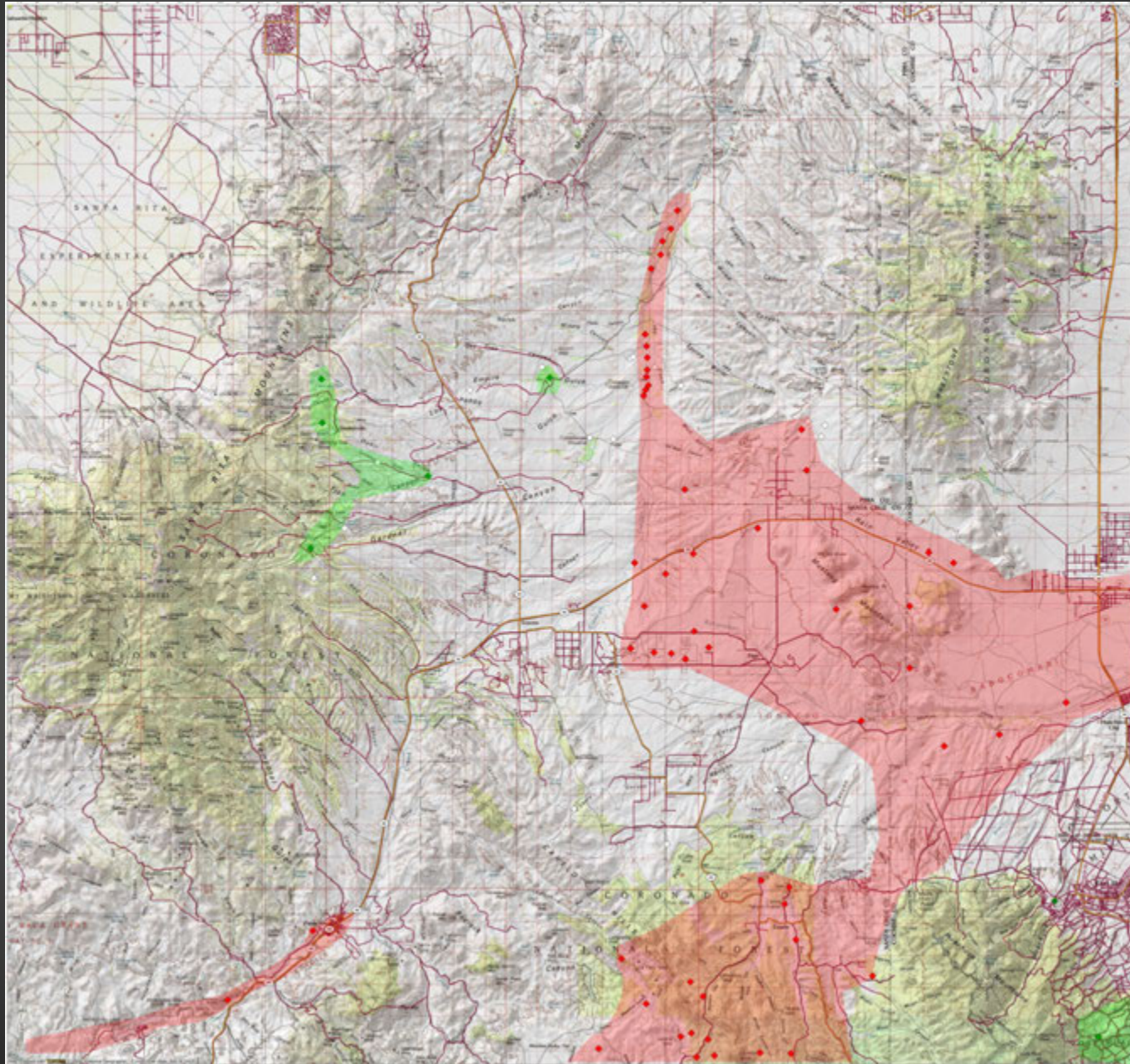


# History of RU2 bullfrog removal efforts and subsequent CLF expansion.



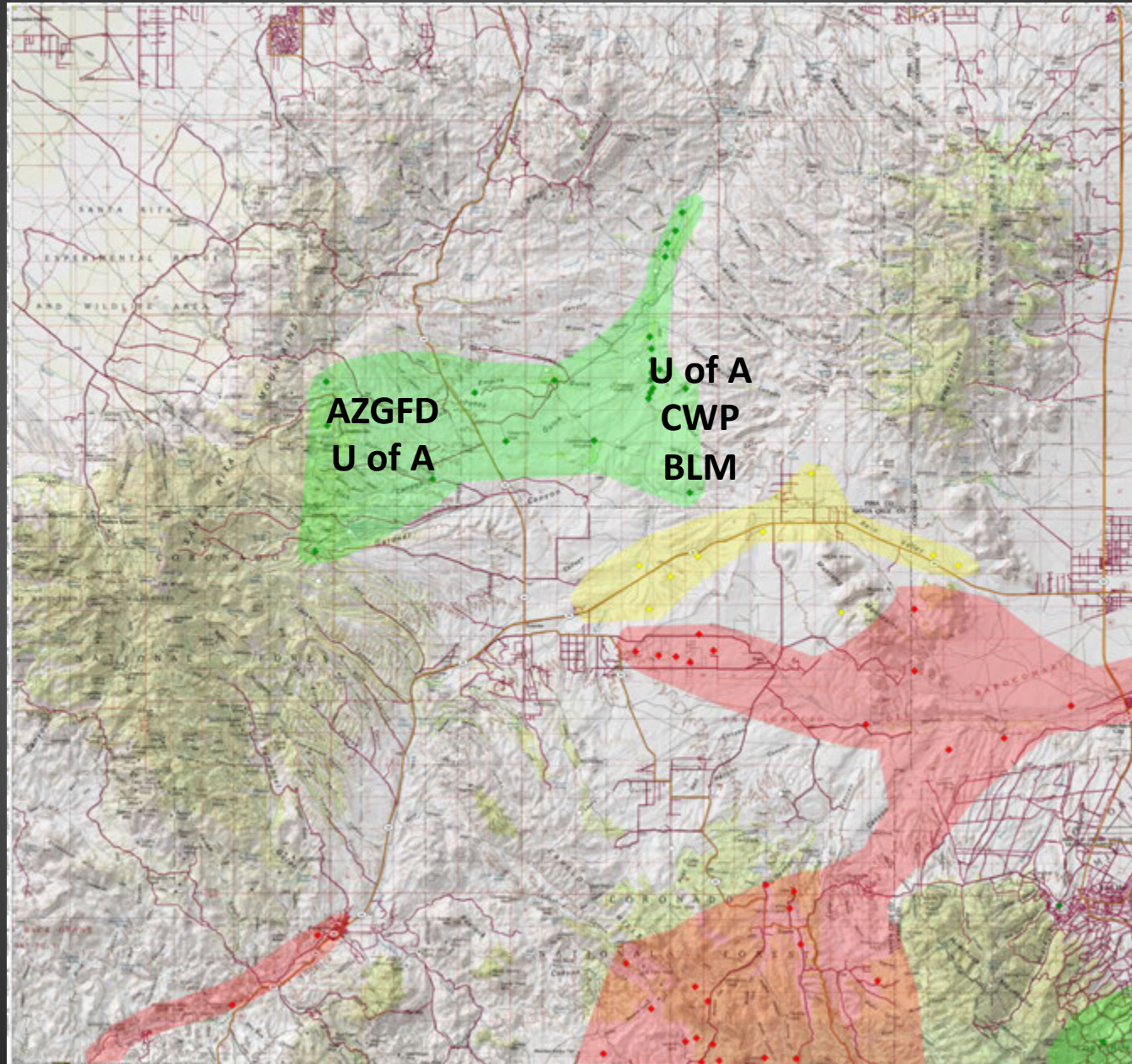

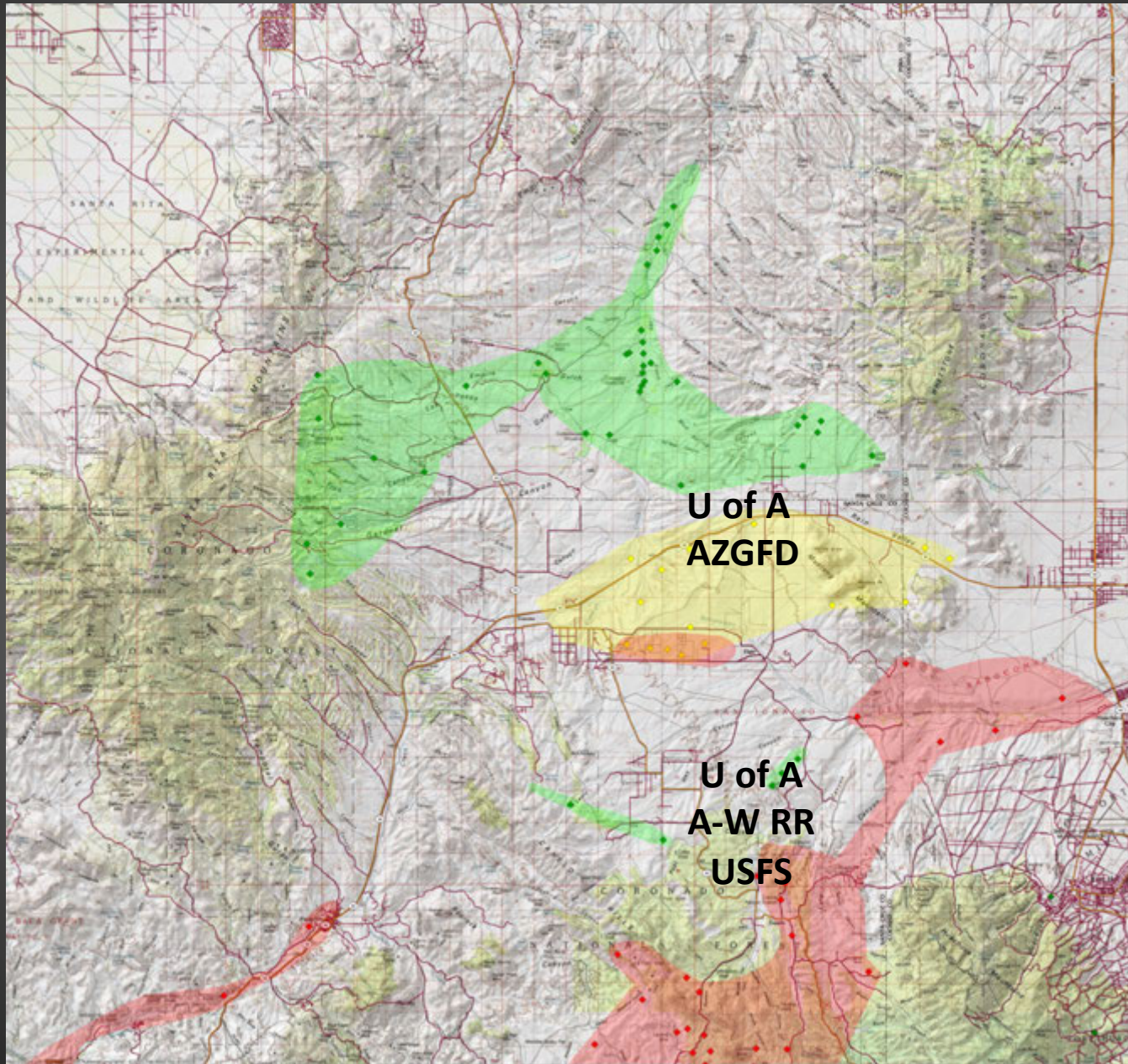

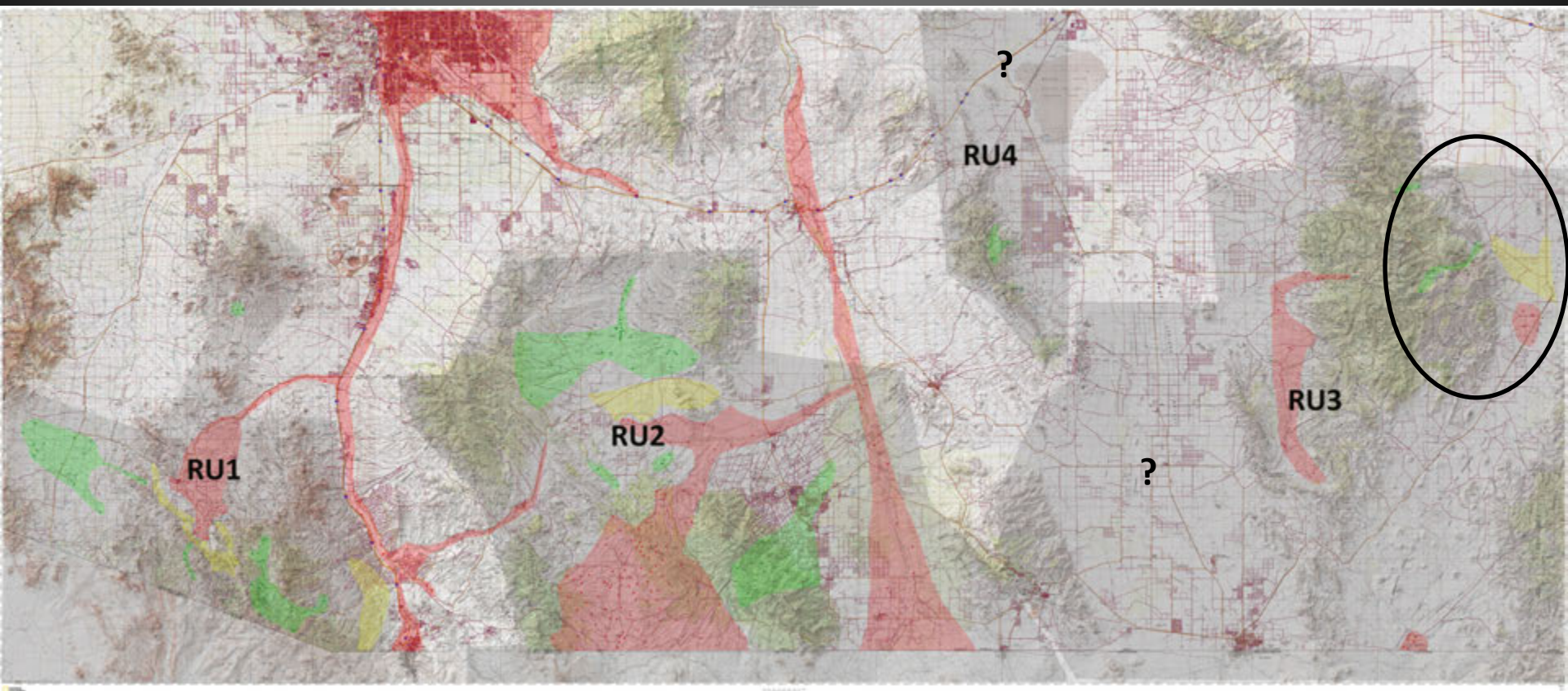

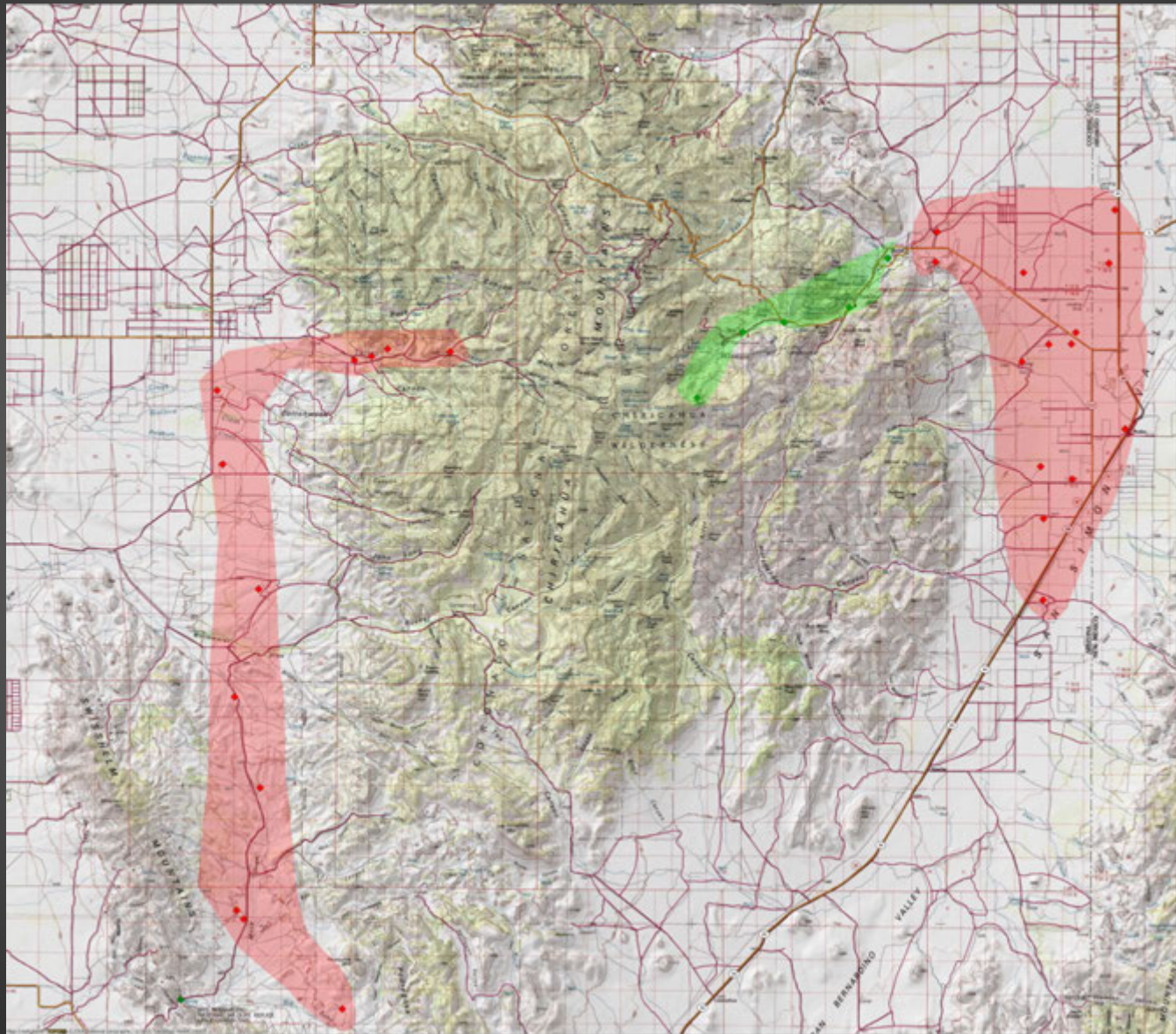


# History of RU3 bullfrog removal efforts.



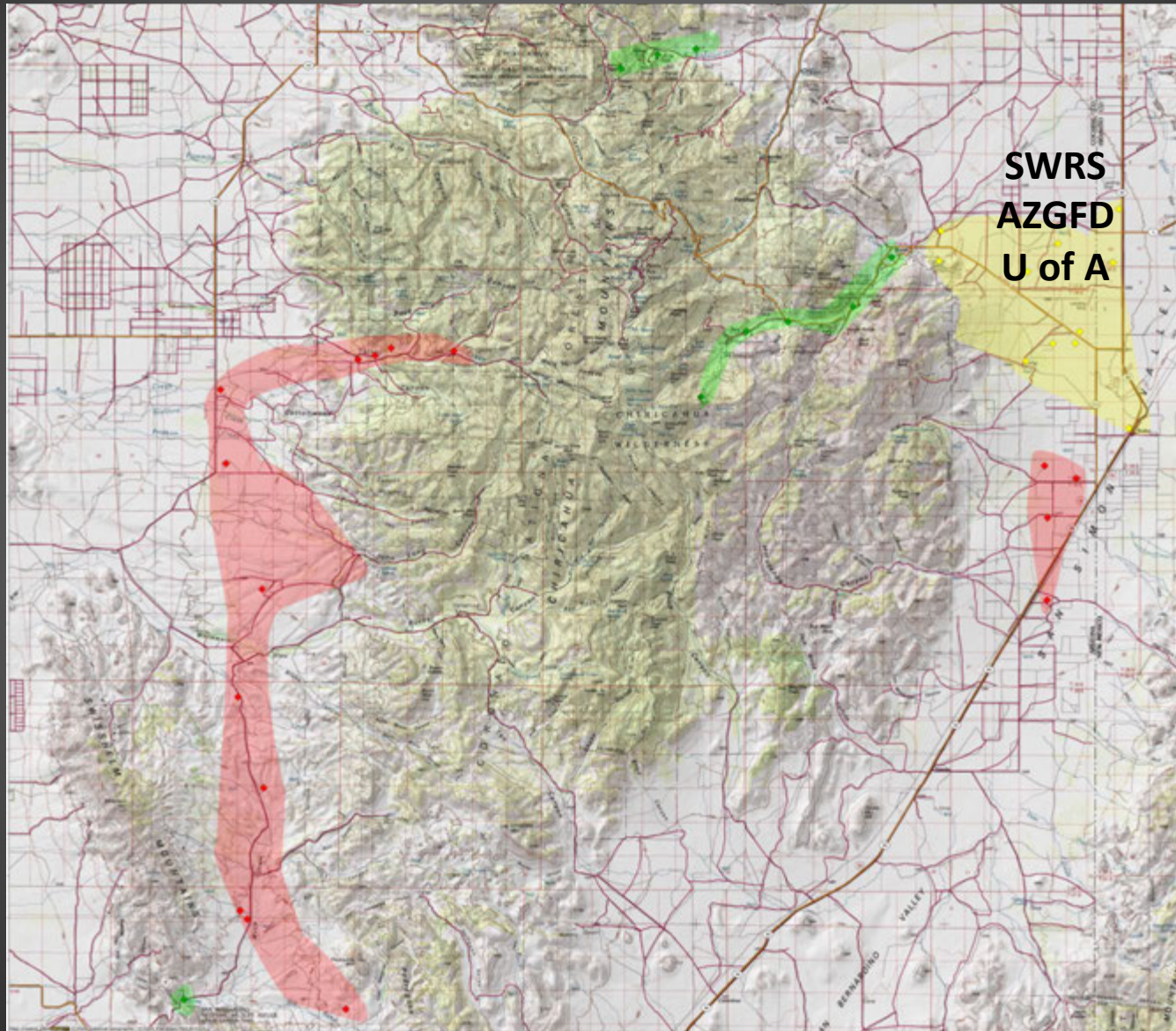


# RU3 in 2015



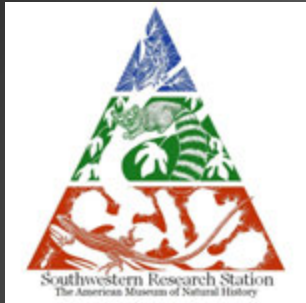
